# FIRE

## RESERVING YOUR ROOM

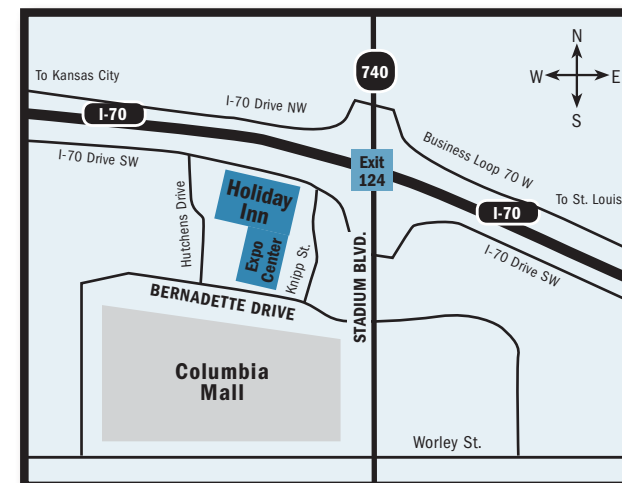

## GETTING TO THE CONFERENCE
